Physical Therapist Assistant is a unique program leading to an exciting career.

Physical therapy is a health profession that involves direct care of individuals who experience temporary or permanent disability due to pain, injury, disease or birth defects. Working under the supervision of a physical therapist, the physical therapist assistant helps people improve their mobility and level of function through the use of exercise, manual therapy and assistive technologies. Job opportunities may be found in hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centers, outpatient offices, sports medicine clinics, schools and home health care agencies.

Greenville Technical College's Physical Therapist Assistant program curriculum consists of 30 credit hours of general education courses called Phase I, which may be completed on a full-time or a part-time basis or transferred in from other colleges. Phase II consists of 46 credit hours of physical therapist assistant technical/professional courses. These can be completed over three and one-half consecutive semesters full-time, or five and one-half extended-track semesters at GTC's Benson Campus, or the Florence-Darlington Technical College campus.

The Physical Therapist Assistant curriculum consists of academic courses as well as 14 total weeks of full-time clinical affiliations.

Admission into Phase II

- CareerTalk required by March 31 of the year a student first submits a Phase II application. Information is valid for two years only.
- Initial advising session with the Phase II PTA program advisor is recommended as soon as you decide on PTA major.
- Once a student completes BIO 210, MAT 120 and ENG 101, he or she is assigned a PTA faculty member advisor for assistance in completing the weighted admission packet.
- Complete all required Phase I courses with a "C" or better and an overall GPA of at least 2.5 by the end of the Spring Semester prior to entering Phase II in the fall.
- Complete the PTA Program Weighted Admissions Application, available online, and submit all required documents to the PTA program director with appropriate documentation no later than March 31.

Upon graduation from Greenville Technical College's Physical Therapist Assistant program, students are awarded an Associate in Applied Science Degree with a major in Physical Therapist Assistant, and are eligible to apply to take the national licensure examination. Upon successful completion of this exam, graduates become licensed physical therapist assistants.
