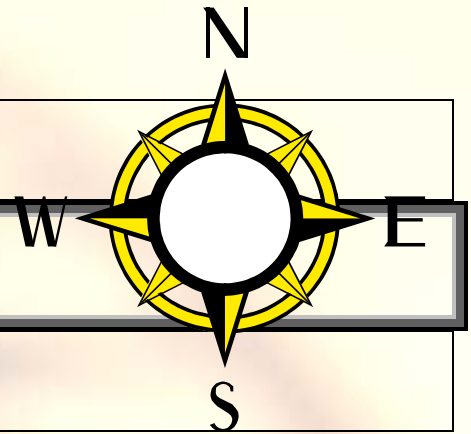


Patterns of Southern Immigration
